Tertiary Sector in Madhya Pradesh The activities relating to transport, storage, communication, banks and trade etc are included in tertiary sector.

As the activities of tertiary sector create services in place of goods and commodities, it is also called service sector. The tertiary sector covers a wide range of activities from commerce to administration, transport, financial and real estate activities, business and personal services, education, health and social work. It is made of the market services sector (trade, transports, financial operations, business services, personal services, accommodation and food service activities, real estate, information-communication); the non-market sector (public administration, education, human health, social work activities). The perimeter of the tertiary sector is therefore defined by complementarities with the primary and secondary sector and it plays an important role in economic development of the economy. Over the last couple of decades, Service sector is also playing a critical role and its contribution in State GDP has seen on rise. Madhya Pradesh, popularly known as "Heart of India" due to its central location has all the ingredients of providing conducive scope for development of service sector in the State.

The Madhya Pradesh has the most unique mix of ethnic groups & tribes, castes & communities. The State have many resources like Mining, forest, Water, etc. yet it is facing many challenges in social development like Education, Women and Child health, Poverty, Gender based discrimination and related socio-economic disparities. Census of 2011 revealed that 72.37% of population resides in rural area with widening socio-economic Rural - Urban gap.

It resulting into migration and overcrowding in cities. Moreover, gender based discrimination has also been a very crucial social issue in Madhya Pradesh economy, as the sex ratio is 931 females per 1000 males. Though, Madhya Pradesh has a marvelous growth trajectory in terms of economic growth, primarily out of agriculture sector. But this much touted double digit agricultural growth has failed in uplifting the poor and reaching to the bottom strata of the society comprehensively. The growth without any social development and trickledown effect could not ensure benefits to the marginalized group of the society. On one side, it has registered mounted agricultural production, whereas on the other side, the extent of malnutrition among tribal children is alarming and bothersome issue. Besides this, poverty has been rearing its ugly heads in the State of Madhya Pradesh despite various efforts of government.
