- The Mahidpur is situated in Ujjain district in Malwa (M.P.) near on the bank of river Kshipra.
- Excavated mound is known as "Bhasma Tekri" (The mound of Ash).
- ⇒ After the excavations of Nagda, Arora, Manoti, Dangwada, Eran and Azadnagar this excavation is done in 3 sessions i.e. - 1986-87, 1989-90 and 1990-91.

- ⇒ There are 3 chalcolithic layers in the site.
- 1) I Period - (c. 2100 B.C. — 1800 B.C.)
 - 2) II Period (1800 B.C. — 1200 B.C.)
 - 3) III Period (1200 B.C. — 600 B.C.)
Remaining are pure Historic layers

Period I (2100 B.C. — 1800 B.C.)
These peoples had not developed independently. They migrated here.

- ⇒ First phase was occupied by the people who were using painted black and Red ware, Red Slipped ware of Ahar and Red Slipped ware Painted with white colour. Red
- ⇒ In which Red Slipped ware belongs to Ahar, but specific Ahar ware is absent.
- ⇒ This early peoples came from somewhere and established here. They lived in mud houses built in circular shape and rectangular shape like chaeol people.
- ⇒ They are using microliths made by Chalcedony, quartz etc. Similarly they are using stone ~~to~~ made items like Pestle stone, hammer etc.

Period II (1800 B.C. - 1200 B.C.) → This is specifically Malwa culture because Malwa ware are found here in big amount. Some other potteries like - BRW painted and Plain, Red Slipped ware, Coarse grey ware

→ Period II and III there are signs of floods which can show that this layer was disturbed by flood.

Period III (1200 B.C. - 600 B.C.) → In this period potteries of Period II were common. The quality of pots decreased.

→ Here some sherd's of degenerated Kaytha Ware in coarse fabric also noticed.

→ Upper layer of this period is overlapped with historic period 600 (B.C.)

Hence we can see the major Chalcolithic site with Malwa ware found prominently here.
